DRIVECAM PUTS BIG BROTHER ON OUR WINDSHIELDS.**

We told the Company the facts, but they didn't listen.



These are the facts:

There is no objective study that shows safety improves with DriveCam.

Until April 15, 2009, when DriveCam got a waiver of two years from the federal government, it was illegal to install a device on the windshield within the area the wipers sweep.

All units that National Grid put in before April 15, 2009 violated Federal law,

All units installed after DriveCam got its exemption have to be “mounted not more than 50 mm (2 inches) below the upper edge of the area swept by the windshield wipers, and outside the driver’s sight lines to the road and highway signs and signals.” (new rule)

Many units violate even that exemption– like the dump truck pictured at left.

THE FIGHT HAS JUST BEGUN AND WE WON'T STOP TIL WE'VE WON!

Here's what the Executive Board has done so far:

- A. Charged National Grid with unfair labor practices at the National Labor Relations Board.
- B. Filed a petition with Federal Motor Carrier Safety Agency to suspend the Exemption and reopen the proceeding to hear more evidence,
- C. Prepared a PSC petition, soon to be filed, asking for an investigation,
- D. Contacted our International to expand the campaign against DriveCam to other TWU locals as well as to unions around the country.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

1. Don't give up – we are in for a long struggle.
2. **Don't stay silent** if you are in a vehicle with a DriveCam unit, and it interferes in any way with your ability to see out, or clearly, or it distracts you from watching the road.
3. Tell your Delegate or shop steward about the problem and call or email our office so we can compile necessary evidence. (TwuLocal101@aol.com)
4. Keep a record of your experience with DriveCam.
